Host: The Downtown Sailing Center ("DSC") invites all sailors (DSC members and non-members), kids of sailors, fundraisers, and sponsors to participate in the Charm City's Ya Gotta Regatta, September 26, 2020, benefitting The DSC's Community and Adaptive Sailing Programs.

The Downtown Sailing Center, a US Sailing Sanctioned Community Sailing Center, works with over 20 non-profit partners to fill the gap of educational and recreational programs for underserved youth and people with disabilities each year.

Regatta Format:

Saturday, September 26, 2020:

- One Design, in the vicinity of Fort McHenry: Fleet racing in DSC J/22s and Sonars. Courses: windward-leeward with drop marks. Other classes fielding 8 boats or more will be admitted as additional classes with prior approval.
- PHRF: Spin and Non Spin Pursuit racing using the PHRF rating system on a course approximately 9NM. The course is in the vicinity of Fort McHenry, towards Fort Carroll, and finishing in front of The DSC.

One Design and PHRF racing will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.

- Adaptive sailing participants will be competing in Hansa Access 303W dinghies, located off the docks, in separate heats, 2-4 short races each (depending on the wind conditions).
- Sonar and Freedom Independence 20s will compete in a distance racing format.

Eligibility: DSC Members and Non-members alike are eligible to participate. Non-DSC Members are invited to skipper a DSC boat in the J/22 fleet but must attend a pre-race boat

orientation and successfully pass a checkout before the regatta. All participants must sign the DSC liability waiver.

All One Design and PHRF teams are expected to fundraise for this annual fundraising event.

Regatta Party to Follow Racing: The Regatta Party will be family friendly but there will be on-site alcohol. The post-racing party will begin at 5 PM.

The regatta party will include food and non-alcoholic beverages, available to all participants and their families. No cost for adaptive sailing participants and their families.

Trophies:

Top Fundraiser Awards: Prizes to be awarded to the top individual fundraiser as well as the top fundraising team.

Adaptive Regatta Awards: Adaptive Sailing awards to be presented to the first place finisher for each heat of racing, as well as the top finisher in the Sonar and the Freedom divisions.

Fleet racing and PHRF Awards: Prizes to be presented to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place One Design racing teams as well as the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finishers of the PHRF spin class, and 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finishers of the non-spin class PHRF race.

Safety and Other Equipment:

PFDs will be supplied. You may bring your own PFD.

Competitors may bring personal equipment on board. This includes a stopwatch, sun protection, water. All personal items, as well as trash, must be removed when leaving the boat. Water will be available to competitors from Signal, Markset, and Safety boats on both days as well as under the pavilion for Saturday, Sept. 28 events.

The Downtown Sailing Center asks for competitors and volunteers to bring and use reusable, non-single-use water bottles for all drinks. Water coolers will be available for all racing areas, as well as on land.

The Downtown Sailing Center is committed to sustainable environmental practices: Bring your own reusable water bottle and coffee mug!

Liability: Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. The DSC will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. Participants will be held liable for boat damage. All participants will need to sign a liability waiver before they participate.

Rights to Use Name and Likeness:

By participating in the Charm City Regatta, competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio, and video recordings, and other reproductions of them made at the venue without compensation.

Directions: The Downtown Sailing Center is located at 1425 Key Highway on the south side of Baltimore's Inner Harbor, adjacent to the Baltimore Museum of Industry on Key Highway, in Federal Hill.

From Downtown Baltimore:

Go south on Light Street.

At the split for Key Highway (near the Maryland Science Center) bear left onto Key Highway. Follow Key Highway approximately 1 mile.

We are located on the left at the Baltimore Museum of Industry. The structure of a green shipyard crane marks the exit and the entrance is on the east side of the brick building just past the crane.

If you get to the Lawrence Street traffic light at Royal Farms, you have gone too far.

From I-95 Southbound:

Follow I-95 to the Ft. McHenry Tunnel - \$4 cash, \$3 ez-pass.

Go through the **tunnel furthest to the right**.

Immediately after exiting the tunnel, take the Key Highway (**EXIT 55**) exit.

Follow the ramp to the light and turn right onto Key Highway.

Follow Key Highway through three traffic lights. Royal Farms is on the left at the second & third lights.

Turn right immediately after the third light into the parking lot of the Baltimore Museum of Industry.

From I-95 Northbound:

Follow I-95 to Key Highway (**EXIT 55**), which is the last exit before the Ft McHenry Tunnel (after the Hanover St. exit).

Follow the ramp down to the traffic light and bear left under I-95 onto Key Highway.

Follow Key Highway through three traffic lights. Royal Farms is on the left at the second & third lights.

Turn right immediately after the third light into the parking lot of the Baltimore Museum of Industry.
